- 1. Called to order at 7:00 PM
- 2. Members present: Craig Taylor, Mike Strieker, Bob Netemeyer, Dennis Middendorf, and Nelson Heinzmann. Also present: Bill Schmaltz of Einstein Consulting and Dan Imming of Imming Insurance Group.
- 3. Committee minutes from October 2021 Insurance Committee meeting were approved.
- 4. Dan Imming explained changes and renewal of Cyber Security coverage. Premium up to \$5,700 annually and deductible up to \$25,000 for \$1,000,000 coverage.

Dan also presented County Liability and Property coverage—annual premium \$350 lower but property values increased on several parcels. This coverage to be approved at the November 15, 2021 County Board meeting.

- 5. Bill Schmaltz of Einstein Consulting gave update on health insurance. Einstein Reports show:
 - a) Costs down 15% compared to last year
 - b) Pharmacy up 10% compared to last year
 - c) Medical Claims down 11% compared to last year
 - d) Fixed costs down 34% compared to last year

The group discussed at length the high costs of imaging at hospitals vs free standing imaging facilities. Free standing could have saved the county \$20,927 in the past year. Committee will have a proposal to consider at the December meeting—possibly Flexible Spending Account.

6. Financial Reports:

a) Through October health insurance without reimbursements \$326,361.95 under budget or a savings of 31%.

b) Through October health insurance with reimbursements \$656,800.09 under budget or 52% savings.

- c) Liability Fund and Workers Compensation Fund stable
- d) County received reimbursement check from True RX for \$4,121.10

- 7. Discussed ICIT phone conference and upcoming assessment for member counties: including input by phone from Larry Johnson, County Board Chairman. Clinton County shared around \$7,100.
